According to Adenike Cole, the purpose of the meeting was to engage heads of partner organizations on the process indicator as a fundamental component of the report from partners and the parent report sent to donors in Germany. She said that donor will want to see the actual impacts of the work of partners and how changes are taking place as a result of their interventions.

Madam Adenike maintained that some or most of the heads of partner organization due to busy sched-

ing in terms of enhancing the visibility and work of the network. As you may be aware, the roles initially played by the Mobile team

have long been transferred to us-coordinators. Yet still, we are performing those roles well with less intervention from the Berlin team.”
